Since most think of sheep as idle, slobbering, untidy, dumb animals who exist only to be shaved or slaughtered. In actuality, all of this is ugly innuendo, because sheep are smarter than cows. According to farmers, cows are herded from the rear by hooting

cowboys with cracking whips, but that will not work with sheep. You push cows but you lead sheep, and in the Middle Eastern world, they will not go anywhere that someone else does not go first – namely – their shepherd – who goes ahead of them to show everything is alright. Because of this, sheep tend to grow fond of their shepherd, while cows are incapable of such bonding.
