Gospel: John 1:29-34

Mathew continues the story of Jesus' Baptism. The Church has a threefold Sacramental step into the fullness of Church life. The Sacrament of Baptism is always the first. It is the commitment of an individual to the Lord, the giving over of one's life to the Lordship of Christ. Without this Sacrament,

you cannot arrive to the second Sacrament which is Acceptance into the Eucharistic community. Finally, the last Sacrament of Initiation is Commitment to Ministry or Service. A Christian, who has no desire to serve, is not celebrating his Baptismal or Eucharistic life. Without question, each of these Initiation Sacraments in today's church life is troubled and found wanting. But these three Sacramental steps remain rich in the movement toward the fullness of Christian life.
