Gospel: Luke 4:1-13

We begin the Lenten Season taking us all the way to Easter Week, into the Easter Season to Pentecost Sunday, fourteen weeks of theologies and liturgies. This is the largest liturgical season of the calendar year. It includes fasting, self denial, prayer, almsgiving, resurrection, proclamation, baptism confirmation, holy spirit, charisma's and discipleship. Nothing is omitted or forgotten during this season. So we begin February 17, 2010 - mortality and death, to May 30, 2010 – immortality and resurrection. This season emphatically stamps to outsiders what the Catholic faith represents to insiders. There is no room for debate in these doctrines we celebrate.

Universal Church – Tests of Catholic Education

According to statistics, total enrollment in U.S. Catholic schools has declined by nearly half a million students in the last 10 years. More than 1,400 schools have shut their doors since 2000. Many families are seeking financial aid (only 10% of students pay full tuition) or are forced to switch to public schools. Dioceses are struggling to subsidize schools, and parishes are finding it difficult because the collections are down.
