Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha, 1656-1680, is to be the first Native American to be canonized. At 4 years of age, her parents and young brother succumbed to smallpox. Kateri's body was scarred by the pox. She converted to Catholicism, and was regularly beaten by her tribe the Mohawks for her conversion. For her safety, she was moved to a new mission. Her saintliness was well known. As a young woman, 1680, she fell ill and as she lay dying her smallpox scars vanished and her face became clear and white. In 2005, a 6-year old boy with bacterial skin eating infection, through prayers for a miracle to Kateri, was healed. The boy is now 11 years old and of the Mohawk tribe. Her feast day will be July 14<sup>th</sup>.
