32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – YEAR B

1 Kgs 17:10-16; Ps 146:7-10; Heb 9:24-28; Mk 12:38-44

Fifteen years ago, on November 4, 2006, I was ordained a deacon by Archbishop Niederauer at St. Pius' Church in Redwood City. It was one of the memorable events of my life. I received lots of gifts and greeting cards from people for my ordination. After the busy day, I came back to my room at St. Patrick Seminary, taking time to open the gifts, while some of my seminarian friends were around with me. They curiously wanted to know what I got. When they saw a big gift, they shouted: WOW! If they saw a simple greeting card with nothing in it, they teased me, speaking in Spanish: "de nada" (meaning "nothing") and they laughed.

One of the most touching gifts was a simple greeting card with a \$5 bill in it. I was really moved by that meaningful gift since I knew very well the person who gave me that gift. She was a poor lady at St. Veronica's parish in South San Francisco where I did my Pastoral Year. She had to take bus from South San Francisco to Redwood City, about 20 miles away, to attend my ordination since she didn't have a car. I really appreciated her presence and thoughtfulness to me. I could imagine the value of this \$5 gift I received from this poor lady.

We may learn a charitable lesson from the widows in today's readings, and also from this poor lady friend of mine. The widow of Zarephath and her son could have had one last modest meal before they died of the famine, but her generosity made her share with the stranger Elijah what she had. Two coins to the people in the Gospel story, or \$5 to us today seem to be very small gifts – nothing... "de nada" – but in Jesus' eyes, as he said, these poor widows have given their whole livelihood (*Mk 12:44*).

As the followers of Jesus Christ, we should learn from the examples of these widows to be charitable toward God and our needy neighbors, not only when we have some superfluous goods which we can give away, but even when we have only the bare essentials for ourselves, we also can give.

Let us remember this saying: "Nobody is too rich to receive; and nobody is too poor to give." How much you give is not important as if you are willing to give, and give with your love. If you don't

have materials to give, can you give your time and talent to the service of God and the Church through serving the poor and the needy? If you don't have money to give, can you show your kindness by exchanging a smile or talking to a beggar, a homeless, or can you visit and comfort those who are sick or lonely?

As Christians we must learn to love as Jesus loves: "to lay down his life for his friends" (*In* 15:13). Our Lord taught us this as the ultimate in Christian charity. He put it into practice for us. We are expected to be willing to imitate Jesus and do likewise. We must be ready not only to risk our own lives in order to save that of a neighbor, but we must be ready to lay down our lives willingly, as needed, to save a neighbor.

Jesus really appreciates those who are poor but have a genuine love, for "love is more valuable than offerings and sacrifices" (Mk 12:33). We ask our loving God to help us to become aware of his loving design, so that we may more willingly give our lives in love and service to God and neighbors.
