FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER – A

Acts 2:14...41: Ps 23: 1 Pt 2:20-25: Jn 10:1-10

"The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want" (Psalm 23).

Perhaps for most of us as Catholics, whenever being mentioned about a shepherd, we might relate right away to Jesus the Good Shepherd, or the pope, a bishop, or a priest. However, we may relate the image of a shepherd to those of us who take the role of leadership to serve in different ministries in our parish community. We may also see the image of the good shepherd in our parents who dedicate themselves to care for their family with love.

In today's gospel, we hear Jesus talking about relationship between a shepherd and his sheep: "the sheep hear the shepherd's voice as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them..."
Jesus used very simple examples that his hearers would understand, since shepherd and sheep were familiar images to his contemporaries, and still are to the people nowadays.

As we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday today, we hear Jesus reassure that relationship between the shepherd and the flock. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He said: "My sheep hear my voice and they follow me." We know that there are many different voices calling us in everyday life: the voice of love, or the voice of hatred; the voice of God, or the voice of evil; the voice of good and caring shepherds, or the voice of careless and scandalous leaders. What voice do you listen to? Are you familiar with the voice of Jesus the Good Shepherd?

God's voice speaks to us in our consciences. God calls each and every one of us to live a different commitment in life: as an ordained minister or a married person. We know that all vocations flow from baptism. As baptized Catholics and all Christians, our central vocation is a call to holiness and to give our lives in service as followers of Jesus Christ.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, let us especially pray to the Lord our Good Shepherd to send more shepherds to feed the sheep, to tend the flock. We need good priests who love the Church; who care for the flock. We don't need priests who enter the sheepfold like thieves, to cause scandals, to confuse the followers, and so to scatter the flock.

We also pray for ourselves to be faithful believers, to be good sheep, to be attentive followers. We pray that we would listen to the voice of Jesus our Lord and Good Shepherd. We pray that we don't be manipulated by distracting voice of evil to attack the Church, to move away from God's love, or to defame our own religion,

As I thank God for the gift of my priestly vocation, I give thanks to God for the gift of your vocations, too. You have answered God's call to live your vocations as married couples, parents, teachers... and to serve the Church in different ministries. Thank you for the many ways you share in service of God and the Church through our parish community.

Today, we the Church focus especially on the prayers for Vocations. We the people of God are urged to support, encourage, and pray for vocations to the priesthood, deaconate, and religious life. Jesus Christ is our Good Shepherd. May we always listen to his voice and follow him because Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. He came so that we might have life and have it more abundantly, if we just believe in him and follow him as the sheep follow the Good Shepherd.
