In today's responsorial psalm we praise the Lord for he is "good and forgiving." Although there are shortcomings in our everyday life, but the Lord is merciful to us, slow to anger, and rich in kindness. Three parables in today's gospel give us a "good ground for hope." We long for the kingdom of heaven.

The kingdom of heaven is like an abundant harvest. The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed sown in a field; it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when fully grown it is the largest of plants. The kingdom of heaven is like yeast mixed in flour to be made delicious leavened bread for people.

The kingdom of heaven is like the life and work of each and every one of us here in our parish. Each person's work is simple and humble, depending on the person's role: as priest or altar servers, as musicians or lectors, or Eucharistic ministers, as assembly or contributors of time, talent, and resource. All are put together as our beautiful gifts offering to God that make the life of our parish community more meaningful. By working together, we make the kingdom of heaven present here among us.

When talking about the kingdom of heaven, we usually think about beautiful images, like the abundant harvest, the grown mustard plant, the leavened bread, the lively parish. However, we should not ignore the fact that the kingdom of heaven and the presence of Satan coexist. "Weeds among wheat" is reality of a harvest. "The evil among the good" is reality of this world. "The sinner among the saint" is reality of the Church.

The harvest is good and abundant, for the wheat is to be gathered into barns. Yet the harvest is also the time for the weeds to be separated from the wheat and to be burned; for the evil to be separated from the good.

We probably learn from today's gospel that the parable of the weeds among the wheat becomes a moral lesson about the day of final judgment when God shows his justice; when the good are rewarded, and the wicked are punished. The Lord our God is both lenient and just. He is lenient in that he waits patiently for the harvest time which allows time for the sinners to repent. Yet, God is just in that he does separate the wicked from the righteous at the end time.

God does not judge without planning ahead of time; the first reading reminds us that God is a patient and kind God: there is "good ground for hope." In all three parables of the kingdom the outcome is assured: justice will come; the smallest seed will grow; yeast will leaven. This assurance is grounded in God's "mastery over all things."

God's mastery leads us to the way of repentance. This is also mentioned in the first parable, where the master advises the slaves not to pull up the weeds, but to let everything grow - give time for repentance. We are encouraged to repent of any shortcoming - any "weed" in our lives - and be faithful to our loving God.

Some of us may have a tendency of living in fear of God's judgment, thinking of ourselves only as weeds to be burned. But the gospel today encourages us to look beyond and see the possibilities for repentance, trust in God's mercy, and be open to God's loving kindness.

Jesus' message today encourages us to live in hope: there is no saint without a past; there is no sinner without a future. In his patience, the Lord allows both weeds and wheat to grow together, both saints and sinners to respond to salvation in the Kingdom. May the Spirit assist us in our weakness, to have courage to come back to God, for the Lord is good and forgiving!
